Thesis Statement: What is the MAIN, overall, overarching, primary, central thing you learned this year at KWoods. You should be able to say it in just ONE sentence. Though I have three spaces below, PLEASE only use one thesis statement. Remember, EVERYTHING you write about should point back to the idea in your thesis statement.
